Purpose. Myopia is a common cause of vision loss, with uncorrected myopia the leading cause of distance vision impairment globally. Individual studies show variations in the prevalence of myopia and high myopia between regions and ethnic groups, and there continues to be uncertainty regarding increasing prevalence of myopia.

Increasing Prevalence of Myopia in Europe and the Impact

In populations with a high prevalence of myopia, these special etiologies probably account for a small proportion of myopes, for example, among diabetics and among premature infants, less than one-third of the observer! myopia was attributable to diabetes or prematurity (Fledelius, 1980, 1983-). Other special etiologies may have a stronger association but are even more rare in the general ...
